About the EU-WOP Programme

The EU-WOP Programme supports peer partnerships that improve the capacity and performance of water and sanitation utilities in EU partner countries. Implemented by GWOPA/UN-Habitat and funded by the European Union, the programme champions not-for-profit partnerships – Water Operators' Partnerships (WOPs) – as a cost-effective, sustainable approach to achieving Sustainable Development Goal 6: clean water and sanitation for all.

Phase1 (2020–2025) Supported 22 WOPs in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Phase 2 (2025–2030) Now open for proposals, with funding available for up to 30 new WOPs.

What is a Water Operators' Partnership (WOP)?

A WOP is a peer-to-peer collaboration between two or more water and/or sanitation operators. It is carried out on a not-for-profit basis with the aim of strengthening public utilities' capacity to deliver safe, inclusive and resilient services.

Resident Partner The utility receiving capacity support.

Supporting Partner The mentoring utility.

Additional Partners Knowledge institutions, facilitators, funders and others contributing to shared objectives.



What's New in Phase 2

Two Funding Windows

- Expanding WOPs builds on previous Phase 1 projects.
- Emerging WOPs new or newly configured partnerships.

Leveraging Impact

- Targeted utility improvements in technical, financial, social and environmental areas.
- Leveraging impact with digitalization, financial linking and human rights for stronger impact.

Increased Support to Coordination

- Funded initial diagnostic visit for shortlisted Emerging WOP applicants.
- Required budgeting for staff time and coordination.
- Support for advocacy and joint learning.

Simplified Reporting

One annual narrative and financial report.

Who Can Apply?

Eligible **Resident Partners** must be public or community-based utilities operating in a country endorsed by an EU Delegation (see country lists below).

Eligible **Supporting and Additional Partners** must be from EU or OECD-DAC countries and operate on a not-for-profit basis.

All partners must be GWOPA members.

All WOP partners must commit to:

- Not-for-profit collaboration.
- Joint design and monitoring of the partnership.
- Adherence to GWOPA's Code of Conduct.

Applications cannot be submitted by a single organization. All proposals must be submitted by a consortium comprising at least one Resident Partner and one Supporting Partner. Additional Partners may also be involved. The EU-WOP Programme supports partnerships only – individual applications are not eligible for consideration.

Grant Size USD 200,000 to USD 400,000

Duration

Up to 48 months

Eligible Costs

Staff time (non-profit/public), travel, supplies, equipment, logistics, coordination and knowledge-sharing.

Co-financing

Cash and in-kind contributions strongly encouraged All partnerships must demonstrate commitment to shared learning, sustainability and mutual respect.
