Excursion Summary

The Salierweg wastewater treatment plant is located on the banks of the Rhine, directly below a bridge. It treats wastewater for approximately half of Bonn's population. The plant is equipped with 13-meter-deep biological reactors, sand filtration, and an independent incineration module. A special feature is that, since 2015, it has had QR codes for quality assurance.

Also to be presented is a wastewater technology training kit. Developed in Bonn, the kit is now used abroad as a compact module for training staff at wastewater treatment plants, including in Jordan.

About the plant:

The Salierweg wastewater treatment plant is located in the middle of a residential area and therefore has to meet the highest requirements for the prevention of noise and odor emissions. This is no easy task when you consider that on a day without rain, around 410 liters of wastewater enter the sewage system every second.
